### **CONSERVATION EASEMENT FUNDING**

The Camp Bullis Regional Conservation Partnership Program (RCPP) is seeking voluntary landowners interested in permanently protecting their property and natural resources from development with a tailored conservation easement. Agriculture, wildlife habitat, and open spaces are compatible land uses that protect the mission and training capabilities of Joint Base San Antonio - Camp Bullis.

Up to **\$3 million** in funding is available for conservation easements, which conserve water resources, agricultural productivity, wildlife habitat, and dark skies.

Landowners in the project area can fill out the Landowner Interest Form to get started. Minimum acreage and site restrictions may apply. Visit our website or contact us for more details. Priority will be based on proximity to Camp Bullis, development threat, connectivity to other conserved lands, and ecologically important elements including waterways and karst features.
